





Forty three Kansans Attend 5th Junior Hereford Expo

The Mississippi Hereford enthusiasts and the town of Tunica hosted the 5th Junior Hereford Expo July 24 - 31. The majority of the days were not the typical climate that most Kansans had expected.

Top Kansas honors were earned by Bailey McKay has she worked her way though the Pee Wee Showmanship heats with her heifer "Ariel" to the Reserve Champion Position. Also in the final line up was Katie Jo Parks.

In other showmanship age divisions, Audrey Hambright and Alex Acheson made the first cut in a strong intermediate group. Brandy Valek and Jason Brown earned their way through the first cut in the senior division. Jason finishing in the top ten of that age group, where they had to fit an animal in front of the judges for the final placing.

In the judging of the cattle one class winner was named from Kansas, that being James Preuss with his August 2003 bull, JP Mr. Bond 3049. The only other bull exhibited from Kansas, JC Platinum 3103 ET, stood 4th for Jason Brown. Sixtytwo polled and horned bulls were shown together this year.

Jason Brown and Bailey McKay earned seconds in the owned heifer division. Jason was in the March 1st - 9th Class, which fell in Division IV of the horned show. Bailey's 2003 9th of February heifer was in Class 106 and the Polled Division VII.

Others showing owned heifers were: Katie Jo Parks, Shane Watson and Kimber Evans. Bred and Owned Heifers were exhibited by: Wade Hambright and Alex and Jessica Acheson.

All the state thirds were earned in the steer division of the show. James Preuss and Kimber Evans walked out with those in Class 2 and Class 5 of the 60 head/seven classes of steers. Kimber's had a check in weight of 1100 with a WDA of 2.34. James' weight was 1265 with a 2.56 WDA. The top 10 carcass steers were recognized in the ring. Kimber's steer placed 7th in the Carcass Contest. Later it was learned that Audrey's placed 12th. Other steers were exhibited Brandy Valek, Audrey Hambright and Tyler Schultz.

One Kansas team of Jessica Acheson, Katie Jo Parks and Bailey Parks participated in the Junior age Team Marketing Contest. Jason Brown, Jessica Acheson and Katie Jo Parks entered the Team Fitting Contest. Bailey McKay helped out the North Carolina group with being their Pee Wee member of that team.



Brandi Valek placed 3rd in the Walter and Joe Lewis Award. She also represented Kansas as our state Queen.

Winning second place in the Photography Colored Scenic Picture division was Katie Jo Parks. Others submitting photos were the Bailey McKay, and Brady, Brooke, Casey & Cody Jensen brothers. Wade Hambright won 3rd place in the Promotional Poster Contest. Cody and Casey Jensen also submitted poster entries. First place Junior Golden Bull Award went to Audrey Hambright.

Bailey McKay and Katie Jo Parks gave their Pee Wee Speeches. The Pee Wee Division is not placed and all participates receive medallions. The Mississippi Hereford Ladies sponsored an Impromptu Advertising Posters Contest, which Katie Jo Parks won. Each contestant was to design a poster around the theme of 'Rollin on the River'.

A number Kansans participated in the Judging Contest. Top performances were made by the following. Lori Hambright placed 2nd in the Adult Division with the Adult Team of Lori, Kevin Schultz, Nancy Preuss, and Lori Stanford placing 2nd over all. The Junior Team of Jessica Acheson, Tyler Schultz and Shane Watson placed 10th. Individually Jessica was 9th. The Kansas Pee Wees took 2nd place team with members Bailey and Seth McKay, Wade Hambright and Katie Jo Parks. Fifth individual in that age group was Katie Jo Parks.

Schultz's, Malone's and Jensen's had also sold exhibited cattle.

Melanie Snavely ran a campaign for the national board. There were numerous qualified candidates this year. Melanie is being encouraged to run again at another time. Kristi Bishop of Basehor finished her term on the board this year.

we all hope she keeps up. Thanks Darla.


